Prof Feleke Zewge, Addis Ababa University, Ethiopia and Prof Harouna Karambiri, 2iE, Burkina Faso could not be connected and also did not receive any response from them regarding the meeting for which communication was sent vide our email dated August 27, 2019.

The following was discussed and deliberated:

- 1. Prof Sanghi from IIT Delhi and Prof Kansal from IIT Roorkee informed about the present status of the students and faculty from ACEs in their respective campuses.
- 2. It was observed that in many instances the information regarding the travel of visitors from ACEs was received only in the last moment, resulting inconvenience to host institutions for arranging their arrival and stay arrangements. This need to be improved upon by sending the information to the host institution in advance by giving sufficient time to avoid the difficulties to the visitors as well as host institutions.

#### 3. Ph.D. students

- a. In many instances, students have been deputed for three months only against available provision of six months and two times during the students Ph.D. research period. For them six months of stay shall lead to some appreciable work, hence ACEs are advised to consider the same for the students who are deputed to Indian institutions in future.
- b. In some instances, Ph.D. students have been deputed just after completing their course work in ACEs institutes and in some instances there is no Ph.D. supervisor assigned to them. Such situation is not desirable as the candidate and Indian mentor faculty shall not be able to do much work as the same should be agreed by their supervisor in ACEs before their coming to India. It is strongly desired that student's Ph.D. supervisor, before their travel, should initiate a dialogue through email with Indian mentor faculty on the proposed work of the student and expected work to be done in Indian institutions.
- c. Since Indian mentor faculty shall spend considerable time with the Ph.D. students, it is desirable that they may be considered as additional supervisor by

ACE for the respective Ph.D. student. For this ACE coordinator from Ghana and Tanzania shall communicate to national and thematic coordinators in near future.

#### 4. M Tech students

- 5. ACEs visitors are advised to contact the thematic coordinators at the respective Indian institutions for any issues they faced during their stay in the Indian institutions.
- 6. For meeting the expenditure on the contingencies for ACEs visitors to their institution, Indian thematic coordinators may like to evolve some procedure, for instance taking temporary imprest, to resolve the issue.
- 7. A thematic workshop (2 4 days duration) with thematic coordinators and other faculty members from Indian Institutions as well as ACEs (Ghana, Tanzania, Ethiopia and Burkina Faso) is planned during Feb/March 2020. ACE Ghana has proposed to have this thematic workshop to be hosted in Accra. All are requested to prepare for themselves and budget it accordingly. A communication from ACE Accra may be initiated at the earliest.
